Naso Points

Asso has 176 verses -- the most verses of any other Torah portion on the One Year cycle.

Asso means to lift up, carry, elevate, bear but is usually translated as "take" in the context of verses 4:21-22.

Naso Points

Through Moshe, ITT assigns the Tabernacle related tasks to the sons of Gershon, Kohat and Merari, sons of Levi.
The census identified 8,580 men able to perform the assigned tasks.
The time of service was from age 30 to 50.

- ☆ Raise up the nation of Israel
- ☆ At Mount Sinai, he wedded himself spiritually to that nation and called her "my people," "a peculiar people" and a "kingdom of priests."

TheDuties of Gershon

 ☆ The parsha begins with the description of the duties imposed on the families of Gershon and Merari in the mishkan.
 ☆ The parsha states that Gershon and Merari are also to be valued and counted.

The inference is that if Torah did not make this plain we may have discounted them.



Kehat and The Holy Ark

Construction Series And the most glamorous of the tasks of the Levites.

☆ It dealt with the holy ark and the tablets of stone of Sinai, among the other holy artifacts of the Mishkan which were in its charge.


☆The ark carried the children of Kehat.

Mundane Work?

Gershon and Merari used wagons and oxen to transport the boards and hooks and curtains and other basic parts of the Mishkan.

Though not as awe-inspiring as Kehat carrying the Ark...but just as necessary.

The Message In The Torah

- Even those who seemingly serve in the most mundane fashion are to be treasured and appreciated.
- One of the teachers of Rashi when aged and no longer able to teach in the yeshiva remained there and served as a helper to clean the building and the ark of the law contained therein.

For there are no mundane tasks when it comes to working together to build the Kingdom of God.

\$\propto 1 Cor. 12:12 For just as the body is one but has many parts; and all the parts of the body, though many, constitute one body; so it is with the Messiah. Everyone |s |mportant



\$\propto 1 Cor. 12:16 And if the ear says, "I'm not an eye, so I'm not part of the body," that doesn't make it stop being part of the body.

In the middle of Parsha Nasso is a warning about jealousy, it's damage and how to overcome it!

\$\proppose 5:14 But a spirit of jealousy had come upon him and he became jealous of his wife, and she was defiled, or, a spirit of jealousy had come upon him and he was jealous of his wife, and she was not defiled.



Sealousy kills a relationship and if left unchecked will eventually lead to murder...

☆ Job 5:2 For anger kills the fool, and envy slays the silly.

Prov. 14: 30 A sound heart is life to the body, But envy is rottenness to the bones.

Prov. 27: 4 Wrath is cruel and anger a torrent, But who is able to stand before jealousy?

- What really overcomes jealousy between a man and woman...

- *∞ 27 × Eish = Fire*

©vercoming Jealousy ⇔The main point really being...



When you put the 57 - Yah back in the center of the relationship and you have HaShem Dwelling in the midst – which overcomes jealousy!

A Bamidbar 6:2-6 (ISR) "Speak to the children of Yisra'el, and say to them, 'When a man or woman does separate, by making a vow of a Nazirite, to be separate to ,

A 3 he separates himself from wine and strong drink...

The Vow of the Nazirite

- Bamidbar 6:4 'All the days of his separation he does not eat whatever is made of the grapevine, from seed to skin.
- \$\$ 5 'All the days of the vow of his separation a razor does not come upon his head.

The Vow of the Nazirite

This passage is why the Haftorah is on Samson...the Nazirite. \Leftrightarrow Why abstain from grapes? **According to Midrash Rabbah and the** Book of Enoch (31:4), the 'eytz by which Adam and Chavah sinned was a grapevine.

Acts 18:18 (ISR)And Sha'ul, having stayed several days more, having taken leave of the brothers, was sailing for Syria, and Priscilla and Aquilas were with him, having shaved his hair at Kenhrea, for he had taken a vow.

- ☆ Act 21:23, 24, "So do this, what we say to you: We have four men who have taken a vow.
- A "Take them and be cleansed with them, and pay their expenses so that they shave their heads. And all shall know that what they have been informed about you is not so, but that you yourself also walk orderly, keeping the Torah.

Act 21:26 Then Sha'ul took the men on the next day, and having been cleansed with them, went into the Set-apart Place to announce the completion of the days of separation – until the offering should be presented for each one of them.

Control Con

Nazir means separate, and the vow ends as per Bamidbar 6:13 And this is the Torah of the Nazirite: When the days of his separation are completed....

Shalom - 2770

 ☆ "Live long and prosper" the Vulcan blessing from Star Trek is a good summary of the first two lines of the blessing in our Torah portion.
 ☆ But it misses the most important concept – peace, shalom.



Peace, shalom can be seen on three levels...

The first is shalom with oneself.
* "for I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content:" Phil. 4:11



- ☆Peace, shalom can be seen on three levels...
- ☆ The second level of peace can be external to yourself, to accepting those things, people, places, possessions, experiences in your life over which you have no ultimate control and finding a way to live with these parts of your life.

- ☆Peace, shalom can be seen on three levels...
- The second level of peace is also referred to as "harmony" – sharing, blending, mixing, joining to create a peace with others and the world that you can almost hear.



- ☆Peace, shalom can be seen on three levels...
- The third level of peace is the shalom we are able to find with God, with the Universe, with powers and forces which are totally beyond us, finding the humility to walk with God at our side, without trying to get God to do our will.
